

EYFS Supervision

The classroom is open from 8 am when Mrs Tapper arrives at school. Parents are able to drop their children from this time. Most children are brought to the classroom between 8.15 and 8.45 am. At this time, Mrs Tapper and Miss Abrahams are in the classroom to supervise the children.

8.45 -10.45: the children have lessons as well as self-initiated learning. They are either inside the classroom or in the outdoor area which is directly outside the classroom. At this time Miss Abrahams and Mrs Tapper supervise the children. When children are working in the outdoor area, one of the available adults will be with them outside.

10.45 – 11.00: playtime in the area opposite the Year 2 classroom. The children are escorted the very short distance to the playground and are supervised by two members of staff. One member of staff is allocated to the EYFS children whilst the other supervises Years One and Two (See playtime supervision rota)

11.00 – 12.00: Lessons and self-initiated learning as previously stated.

12.00 – 12.30: lunch; the children are escorted to the dining room and are served lunch by teachers and lunchtime supervisors. Three members of staff are on hand to serve lunch and support healthy food choices. One member of staff is allocated specifically to the EYFS children.

12.30 – 1.00: playtime in the grass area. Two adults are outside with the EYFS, Year One and Year Two children. One adult is allocated specifically to the EYFS children.

1.00 – 3.30: lessons and self-initiated learning as previously stated.

Activities and lessons which take place outside the classroom:

Swimming

Reception children swim with those in Year One (eight children in total). The children are escorted to the swimming pool by Miss Hurren and she supervises them getting changed. Miss Hurren gets into the water with the children during their lesson. They are met at the poolside and taught by Mr Burn (Outdoor Education teacher).

Forest School

Forest School takes place in the school grounds. Reception, Year One and Year Two participate in Forest School altogether. The fire pit is located in the area next to the Year Six playground and many activities take place there. The children are given extensive instructions on how to behave around this area. The fire pit is always attended. However, on occasions we make use of the wonderful grounds available to us. Forest School is led by Miss Abrahams (Forest School leader level 3 qualification by December '19) and Mrs Tapper (Forest School leader level 3) and supported by Mr Cowey (Year 2 teacher) and Mrs Weston (Year 2 TA).

Music

Music is taught by Mrs Foulds. The children are taken to the hall by Mrs Tapper and she remains with the children throughout the lesson. She then brings the children back to the classroom.

ICT

ICT is taught by Mr Cowey and he and Mrs Tapper take the Reception and Year One children to the ICT room and bring them back to the classroom.

P.E.

Reception and Year One are taught P.E. together on Tuesdays with Mr Cowey. He is assisted by Mrs Tapper.
Mr Burn teaches Reception and Year One P.E. together on Thursdays.

French

Reception and Year One are taught by Mrs Redmond in their own classroom.

After School Club

Those children requiring After School Care (from 3.30 onwards) are escorted next door into the Year Two classroom. Here they will be supervised by Mr Cowey (Year Two teacher) from 3.30 until 4.40. After this Mrs Elliston takes over from Mr Cowey and supervises the children from 4.40 onwards. Children are able to stay until 6 pm should this be required. Both Mr Cowey and Mrs Elliston are assisted by one of the gap assistants. On Wednesdays two gap assistants help Mr Cowey/Mrs Elliston. On Fridays After School Care is run by Mrs Elliston and is available from 3.30 until 6 pm in the Year Two classroom. Mrs Elliston is supported by a gap assistant here.

Those children who stay beyond 5.30 pm have the option of being taken to tea in the dining room by Mrs Elliston.

After School Activities

Ballet, Gymnastics and Outdoor Education are offered as optional after school activities. These are offered to Reception, Year One and Year Two children and they are taught in one group. They are run by Miss Hurren (Ballet), Miss Pegg (Gymnastics) and Mr Burn (Outdoor Education).

Ballet runs from 3.30 until 4 pm and Gymnastics and Outdoor Education run from 3.30 until 4.15 pm.

After Ballet and Gymnastics have finished, children are collected directly from these activities by their parents/carers.

Mr Burn returns those children attending Outdoor Education to the Year Two classroom and they are collected from there by their parents/carers.
